## Heart to Heart

### ACSI Convention

I had the privilege of attending ACSI convention last week. It was amazing and informative. ACSI is committed to Christian; Bible based education first and foremost. I also attended the Western Christian Heroes dinner on November 8. Again I saw that God had planted a vision in my heart for Christian education that was the same as Western Christian and ACSI. The vision is to train and educate children to know God and His Word within the context of a loving supportive community.

The difference is that in the PSP the parents are called to do this. In the Christian schools, the teachers have that responsibility. I was so blessed to talk to Western Christian superintendent, Blair Bryant this last week and hear his support for home schooling and what parents are trying to accomplish in the education process. We are unified with our school in heart and in purpose.

Here are some points I learned at the ACSI convention and my take on application for home schooling.

1. Priority #1 is getting your students to work. Post agenda on the board. This raises the level of student achievement and engages students right away. Home school moms can do this on a white board or even print out agenda and post it where your students will be working.
2. Procedure is the way we do things right. Tell each student the procedure. This is done daily. You must a) teach b) rehearse c) reinforce. In school this involves going to your seat, putting your back pack behind desk, handing in homework, not talking unless you raise your hand. In home school this can involve: always start school the same time and same place. Begin with prayer, Bible reading, math, English, etc.
3. Rules have consequences when broken. This involves defiance and disobedience of specific requirements. These are different than procedures.
4. Most successful classrooms are organized, consistent, structured, safe, reliable, stable and loving. All good teachers have a plan. Organization procedures bring order to chaos and clarity to confusion. Home school moms have many options to help with this such as the Abeka curriculum parents' guide. For Moms who like to plan and organize, you can also come up with your own plan. And lastly "The noblest of all professions is teaching"

## Five Levels of Communication

Gary Smalley, in his video series “Hidden Keys to Loving Relationships” talks about the five levels of communication involved in all relationships. Beginning with the most shallow and ending with the deepest form of communication are: Clichés, facts, opinions, feelings, and needs. I can exist forever on the first three levels. I can spend whole evenings with people and talk about sports, the weather, and politics (if I know they are of the same persuasion). After an evening out Marilyn will say, “did you have any interesting conversations?” I usually reply with a “no not really.” Usually, Marilyn will have had several deep conversations going to the deepest level. Sometimes when we are meeting with business associates of mine I try to remind her to keep it light.

I believe most men are the same as me. We can exist on the surface forever. This makes it a challenge to share the Gospel. Sharing Jesus is the deepest level of communication. Sometimes someone will begin to share with me their most intimate concerns and it is the perfect time to share about Jesus. It amazes me that Marilyn can exist on that level with EVERYONE. It doesn't matter who she is talking to. It can be a fellow Christian or just someone in her aerobics class. Give Marilyn enough time (maybe five minutes) and she is sharing Jesus and the other person is also sharing on the deepest level.



I have learned a lot through forty years of marriage to Marilyn. Husbands and fathers need to create a safe environment for their wives and children to feel free to communicate on all five levels. Here are some suggestions on how to create that environment.

1. Spending time. You have to give your wife time to communicate. Now that we are alone and not raising kids, this is easy. It is more of a challenge when you have a full house. We would try to take time before dinner to sit and talk.
2. Have dinner together. Great conversations can happen while eating dinner. Marilyn, of course, is usually the one who can turn surface talk into something meaningful.
3. Speak about Jesus. Christians have Jesus at the center of their lives. He is the invisible One everywhere. The five of us would bring Jesus into the conversation all the time. Talking about Jesus is level five communication. Having Jesus as a part of your communication is one of the most important things you can do to leading your children to Christ. One question to raise at the dinner table is, “What scripture did you read today that made an impression on you.” You, Dad, should be prepared for that question yourself.
4. Reactions. When your wife wants to talk to you about something how do you respond? Do you react defensively? Do you react with anger? Nothing destroys intimacy like anger, defensiveness, and hurt feelings. If either partner in a marriage reacts emotionally when engaged in level five communication, you will soon have little intimate conversation.
5. Be interesting. This is accomplished by truly being interested in the other person. Learn how to draw them out by asking the right question. Work on your communication skills for the ultimate purpose of sharing the Gospel. Here is a test: If you are alone in the living room, do your children and wife naturally gravitate to you and are they eager to talk to you?

**Christmas Chapel schedule on Friday Dec. 12th...**

Kindergarten-4th graders are to arrive as normal at **9am Friday December 12th**. Students should immediately go to chapel while parents & friends should wait outside or downstairs. Students will have a dress rehearsal beginning at 9am until about 9:45 when doors will open for family and friends to be seated. Christmas chapel will begin promptly at 10am. The preschool class will perform first, any questions about preschool should be addressed to their teacher Christina Toland.

Students in the 5th-8th grade group who have come to our practice/workdays will need to arrive at 8:00am to set up all the props and backdrops. 4th grade soloists and 4th graders with speaking parts should arrive at 8:30am.

**Costumes!** Every grade should be wearing assigned costumes! If you are unable to provide your child with a costume please contact me and we will see what we can do. The older kids are sewing bible costumes for some of the 1st & 2nd graders but we probably won't be able to create enough costumes for them all.

Kindergarten - Kids should dress as farm animals. Simple costumes are fine such a plain colored t-shirt that coordinates with an animal hat or mask.

1st & 2nd grade - bible people costumes - Bible style tunics or even a simple homemade costume such as brown pants and brown shirt with a piece of fabric draped over the shoulder and tied at the waist should be fine. The older kids are also sewing some bible costumes for this age group although we won't have enough for everyone. Please coordinate with your teacher on whether or not you need a bible costume or can provide one for your child.

3rd - Heavenly Host of Angels - All kids should be wearing white or off white shirt and if possible white pants. They can also have silver or gold accents. I promised the boys they could be warrior angels so they may wear fake armor and carry a plastic sword and shield

4th grade - Dress in modern day bright colored clothes - Bright t-shirts in neon/bright colors, any kind of pants/skirts are fine. Kids may also wear sunglasses.

5th-8th graders on set crew and backstage crew should be in black or dark colors

## DISNEY YOUTH EDUCATION PROGRAM

**Thursday, December 4<sup>th</sup>:** Grades 3<sup>rd</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>. Disney Youth Education Series programs take place in the information-rich setting of the Disney parks and give students a hands-on, educational adventure. Practice teamwork, critical thinking and problem-solving skills as your group participates in one-of-a-kind moments that use the magic of Disney to make learning even more impactful. Both programs will take place in California Adventures Park. **We need a minimum of 10 kids per program.**

**Exploring the Golden State** – Students in **grades 3th - 5th** act as early settlers as they travel through Disney California Adventure Park to explore the four regions of California; Native Americans, the Gold Rush and California Missions. During this 2.5-hour program students will learn about the state's rich history including the influential events and people that shaped the Golden State including Chuck Yeager, Amelia Earhart, Howard Hugh, John Muir and Walt Disney. They will also be inspired as they learn of the obstacles early Californians overcame to fulfill their dreams.

**Key Learning Points:**

- Discuss 3 famous aviators who impacted California history.
- Identify the 4 regions of California on a map.
- Compare and contrast immigration and migration.
- Articulate the who, what, where, when and why of the Gold Rush.
- Learn about the culture of 2 Native-American tribes of California.

**Energy and Waves Physics Lab 201** – Students in **grades 6th – 12th**. Witness physics principles at work in creating true to form Disney attractions. With hands-on experiments and demonstrations, students come to understand the fundamentals of acoustics and optics, and the different mediums that affect the transmission of light and sound waves in this 2.5-hour field study.

**Key Learning Points:**

- Explain the phenomenon of binaural hearing.
- Define a medium and the nature of acoustics.
- Articulate and demonstrate how solids, liquids and gases affect sound.
- Describe and demonstrate a compression wave.
- Explain the relationship between electricity and magnetism.
- Identify magnetic properties and articulate several applications of magnetism.
- Distinguish the difference between permanent magnets and electromagnets.
- Describe how linear induction motors can be used in transportation systems.
- Illustrate how white light is composed of different colors.
- Articulate how different colors of light are made up of different wavelengths.
- Demonstrate how light is reflected in an object and can be projected through a lens.

**TIME:** Exploring the Golden State begins at 10:00 am and Energy and Waves Physics Lab begins at 10:30 am. Both programs will be about 2.5 hours. When you sign-up, please indicate which program cost option you want.

**COST:** Each program cost options are as follows:

- The Disney Youth Education Program Experience Only - \$38 per person.
- The Disney Youth Education Program Experience **plus** admission to **one** park - \$67 per person.
- The Disney Youth Education Program Experience plus admission to both parks - \$86 per person.

For the first 10 kids, two chaperones (parents) are allowed (and they would choose which cost option they want to pay), and for every 10 kids thereafter, one chaperone is allowed (so if we had 30 kids attend a program, then 3 chaperones could attend that one program). No more than the allowed number of chaperones can attend (so most parents would not be permitted to attend the program). However, if you have a Disneyland pass you can go into the park, but you would not be apart of the tour.

## MEDIEVAL TIMES

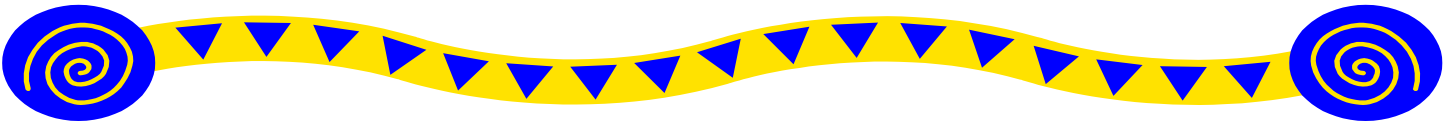

We will engage in age appropriate discussions along with enjoyable, yet thought provoking activities for ladies and gentlemen in grades K – 8.

**PE - Teacher:** Monique Boore is a WCS PSP mom of two current students and one WCS PSP graduate. she is a 4th degree black belt in Taekwondo and has 10 years of dance background. ### **Theory of Knowledge**

Course Description:

The goal of Theory of Knowledge (TOK) is to challenge students to critically evaluate what they have learned throughout their education. It provides an opportunity for students to reflect on the nature of knowledge. God has revealed the most important truths about Himself and our salvation. While holding firmly then that there is truth, each discipline (history, social sciences, physical sciences, the arts, ethics and mathematics) is evaluated in terms of its methodology and limitations and in terms of the truth claims which these disciplines make. TOK equips students to articulate what they believe and why they believe it.
