I had to pray to have the right attitude.

Humility goes along way when parenting. I asked my daughter what I did best as a mom and worst. She said she liked it when I said I was sorry. It made her want to say she was sorry and then she felt close to me. She then said she couldn't think of anything that was bad. Wow, apologizing is a powerful thing. Make sure you practice it from the moment they can understand. I watched my daughter apologize to her 4 year old rambunctious boy for overreacting to him pushing over the coffee table with his feet. He cried at her disapproval, but totally melted into her love. Yes dear Moms, make sure you walk in humility before your little ones. It will help produce the fruit of righteousness in their hearts. Remember James 1:20 The anger of man doesn't produce the righteousness of God. As my Pastor Jim Reeve says: "Make a choice to rejoice!"

A Word to Fathers ~

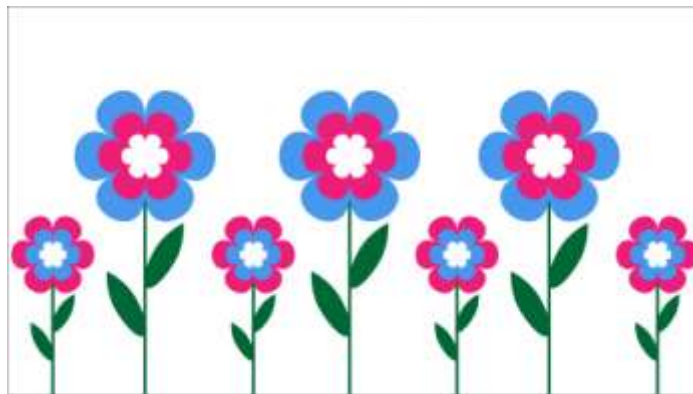

Mr. Buckingham

When I was attending the eighth grade my school had one male teacher, Mr. Buckingham. He was the most respected teacher at the school. I had been attending the same school district my entire public school career. I grew up with Mr. Buckingham, he had been the janitor until I graduated from the fourth grade. He worked his way through college while raising a family.

Of course, all of the teachers respected Mr. Buckingham. We boys respected him for another reason; he was the possessor of the Board of Education. The Board of Education was a handmade paddle that would be prominently hung on the wall next to his desk. If any boy needed discipline, Mr. Buckingham would be the administrator. If a boy was unruly the teacher would simply say, "I want you to go visit Mr. Buckingham." Punishment would be swift. The teacher would hand you a note and you would proceed to Mr. Buckingham's room. You would enter a classroom of thirty kids and you would hand the note to Mr. Buckingham. Everyone in the room would know what was about to happen. You would face the audience and bend over. One swat was all it took. You tried with all your might not to show any reaction because of the audience of thirty of your friends and acquaintances.

How would I know what took place in that classroom? Because I had to visit that classroom—once. Why am I sharing this story? I think I miss the fact that young men are not choosing to teach in the elementary grades. I also miss the lack of respect for authority and the wisdom of a good swat to keep a young boy on the right path.

Terra Nova 3 testing for grades Kindergarten thru 8th will take place Tuesday, **April 7th, Wednesday, April 8th, and Thursday, April 9th.** On Tuesday, April 7th, everyone will need to arrive, park and have your children to their classrooms by 8:15 am and testing will begin at 8:30 am (TEACHERS WILL NEED TO ARRIVE EARLIER FOR A SHORT MEETING AT 7:45 am – more details to follow). Testing on Tuesday and Wednesday will end around 12:00 pm and will end around 10:30 am on Thursday. The Kindergarten class will only test on Tuesday and Wednesday. We will be testing at the Western Christian High School campus – 100 W. 9th St., Upland. We need every available mom to help during testing. Please arrange your schedule so you will be available to help all 3 days (or at 1 or 2 days). Pre-School For Terra Nova Volunteers: This year there will be Pre-School available for children ages 2, 3 and 4 years old for Terra Nova volunteers ONLY. This service will only be provided for Terra Nova volunteers on the day or days they are helping with testing. The Pre-School facility is located at the Western Christian High School campus in Upland where we will be testing.

Terranova 3 Testing Fee: The testing fee is \$22.00 per child. Please make your check payable to Western Christian Schools (separate from your tuition check and *write in the memo area Terranova 3 fee*). You can mail your payment to Marilyn Stephens (124 N. CALIFORNIA SCIENCE CENTER - DEAD SEA SCROLLS AND JERUSALEM 3D IN IMAX

THURSDAY, MARCH 26th. All ages. Come discover the most significant archaeological find of the last century – the Dead Sea Scrolls. The California Science Center in cooperation with the Israel Authority is proud to present the largest Dead Sea Schools exhibition ever mounted outside of Israel, featuring over 600 ancient artifacts on display. This special exhibition explores the science and significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls, manuscripts written and hidden in caves 2000 years age and not discovered until 1947. New Class - Yearbook

Yearbook is a primarily home based class responsible for production of the annual Western Christian PSP yearbook in a single semester as an elective course. Students learn the techniques and principles of yearbook journalism, the graphic principles of layout, editing and design. The goal of the staff is to produce a journalistically sound, creative, and unique book on time; foster student growth in journalism and graphic design; develop leadership skills; and provide experience in business/deadline management. The intention of this class is to provide students with professional marketable skills they can use beyond their high school experience.

Your student will be earning a year's worth of credits (10) in one semester.

Students will employ the basics of page design, photo journalism, writing for copy, headlines, and captions. Additionally, students will learn the ethics of news writing, desktop publishing, use of graphic design software.

Prerequisites: Access to a computer with internet will be necessary as all students will be working on page assignments at home using our yearbook software remotely. Signed code of conduct.

Course Description: This course is designed to teach the skills necessary to produce the school yearbook, which offers a complete record of an entire school year. The year begins by planning the coverage for the school year and designing a unifying theme for the book. Students will study layout and design techniques, writing and editing copy, headlines and picture captions. This course provides the study of and practice in gathering and analyzing information, note taking and photography. Students will learn strategies of planning, marketing (ad sales) and distribution of the yearbook. Students will learn proofing strategies and work independently with photographers. Deadlines require that staff members work after school and on weekends as necessary. Students will learn good work habits and are responsible for all phases of yearbook publication.

Course Competencies: Upon completion of the course students will be able to:

1. apply the basic principles of page design, editing and layout
2. operate software
3. write copy for captions and text
4. shoot, select, and crop photographs for layout
5. execute a publication strategy

Projects: helping with pictures throughout the year, and the distribution of yearbooks.

References: The internet, magazines and other yearbooks may be used as references.

Class Expectations:

Attendance – It is very difficult to produce a great yearbook if you are not producing your share of the work. This is an independent class; your daily performance affects the lives of everyone else on the yearbook team and everyone expecting a great yearbook. Be productive and meet your deadlines and carry your own weight!

Positive Attitude – If everyone keeps a positive attitude and is willing to lend a helping hand then our life will go much smoother for the next five months. Yearbook is incredibly stressful at times. Be aware of your stress and how it affects the way you interact with your peers.

Class Management – As a student of Western Christian PSP you are responsible for knowing and following all policies of our school reflecting our Lord as you conduct your yearbook responsibilities. You are a representative of the entire yearbook staff and your actions reflect each of us.

Additional Class Support – If at any time you feel you are unable to complete tasks or assignments solely from your home you are welcome to come to the my home for additional support, or set up a telephone meeting, text or email assistance are also available. My complete contact info is provided below and you are encouraged to seek as much assistance as you need. We operate this class remotely solely for the student/parents convenience but I welcome any meetings needed at my home.

Confidentiality – Part of the allure and excitement surrounding the arrival of the yearbook is surprise. DO NOT RUIN IT FOR EVERYONE. Themes, ideas, and cover designs that are discussed in our class stay within closed doors.

Deadline Policy – It is a simple fact of life; the real world revolves around deadlines. Yearbook is a real world class. Blossom Publishing Company assigns the yearbook staff deadlines and the advisor and editors establish mini deadlines so the company's deadlines are met. Not meeting deadlines results in the company assigning late charges or possible delaying the shipment of the book. FAILURE TO MEET DEADLINES WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

Grading: Students will be assessed on meeting deadlines, the quality of work produced including layout design, writing copy, fairly showcasing many students rather than the same ones over and over and cropping photos. Students' grades will also be greatly assessed by their work ethic.

In order to explore the root of things that happen, the Christian historian must include philosophy and theology in his study. If he does not, then according to philosopher and historian Josef Pieper, he "is altogether unable to attain a serious view of the totality of history."

The goal of Theory of Knowledge (TOK) is to challenge students to critically evaluate what they have learned throughout their education. It provides an opportunity for students to reflect on the nature of knowledge. God has revealed the most important truths about Himself and our salvation. While holding firmly then that there is truth, each discipline (history, social sciences, physical sciences, the arts, ethics and mathematics) is evaluated in terms of its methodology and limitations and in terms of the truth claims which these disciplines make. Each individual needs to be prepared to give an answer for their hope in Christ (1 Peter 3:15) and perhaps for our academic beliefs as well. TOK equips students to articulate what they believe and why they believe it.
