
Real Christianity

We might even give ourselves a pat on the back when we have resisted the wide gate of compromise for the narrow gate of obedience. Our actions are important but should that be our focus?

I have discovered a new book that was written four hundred years ago. The author is John Flavel who was an English Puritan minister born in 1627. The book is called "Keeping the Heart, How to Maintain Your Love for God." (Available at www.truthforlife.org) Basically, as explained in the introduction by J.I. Packer "Real Christianity is communion with the triune Lord through Jesus Christ." It cannot be measured by your actions, but only through your deep fellowship with Christ. Ez. 36:26, 27 says, "I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh." Our new heart becomes our source of faith. It is up to us to keep our hearts pure and singularly focused on Christ. John Flavel takes you through the process on how to accomplish this by warning us of the many pitfalls we encounter throughout our lives.

Brothers, it is easy to get caught up in the cares of this world. We need to keep our focus on God and not, as Jesus warns in Revelation 2:4, "You have left your first love." Therefore we need to, "Keep your heart with all vigilance for from it flows the springs of life. Prov. 4:3

SEA WORLD HOME SCHOOL DAY 2014

The Sea World Instructional Field Trip program is a self-guided educational experience that focuses on ocean animals – their habitats, adaptations, and conservation. The program will include an animal training program of sea lions or dolphins. You can either sign-up for the half-day program or the full-day program. PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS YEAR THE HALF-DAY TICKETS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. IN THE PAST, SEA WORLD HAS HAD DIFFICULTY WITH HALF-DAY FAMILIES (All home school groups – not just our group) LEAVING BY THE 1:30 PM TIME. BATTLESHIP IOWA

THURSDAY, MAY 15th. Grades K – High School. Welcome Aboard! Battleship IOWA is a unique opportunity for you and your kids to engage with the past and connect with history through an oriented adventure on board the Battleship of President's. Built in 1940, the USS IOWA served our country for over 50 years. Designated the “World's Greatest Naval Ship” due to her big guns, heavy armor, fast speed, longevity and modernization, she kept pace with technology for more than 50 years. During her more than 50 years in service, IOWA has welcomed and escorted our nation's Commander in Chief on many occasions. No other battleship in our nation's history has been host to more U.S. Presidents than the IOWA. The IOWA served her country in World War II, the Korean Conflict, the Cold War and Post Cold War. Today veterans, their proud families, school children and curious international tourists are awed by IOWA's proud legacy as one of the fastest and most powerful ships ever to sail the world's oceans. Teak decks and steel bulkheads echo the words and deeds of significant individuals including three U.S. Presidents, distinguished military figures, countless foreign dignitaries, and most importantly, thousands of her own heroic IOWA sailors. **Just a few of the highlights on this 1 ½ to 2 hour guided tour:** crew living areas on the tour show you how officers and crew slept, ate, and relaxed when not on duty; IOWA's World-famous Captain's Cabin was the actual living and sleeping quarters of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. FDR and his War Cabinet planned major WW2 strategy at the table in 1943; see the recently restored Admiral's Bridge, where three of America's Five-Star Admirals observed IOWA's underway operations; plus much, much more to see. **Due to the historic nature of the ship, wheelchairs, walkers, and strollers are not permitted on-board.**


TIME: Please arrive by 10:10 am. The tour will start promptly at 10:30 am.

South towards Long Beach, Merge onto the 91 Fwy. West, merge onto the 110 Fwy. South, merge onto the CA-47 Fwy. North towards Vincent Thomas Bridge/Terminal Island/Long Beach, take the South Harbor Blvd. Exit and continue on S. Harbor Blvd and 250 S. Harbor Blvd. Is on the right. You can park in the parking lot adjacent to the ship for \$1/hr.

Survey of American Government Course Description (spring semester)
