## A Word to Fathers ~

### Respect and Discipline

Ninety percent of what your child will need to be a success in this world is learned in the home. What a child needs to learn at home can be boiled down to two areas—respect and discipline. Both of which came from my father.

Every boy loves his mom but he has to be taught to respect her. When a young man begins puberty, he sees himself more like the man of the house and thinks he can talk down to his mom. Here is where the father steps in. Not only does the father display respect but he makes sure that his children respect their mom. I can remember clearly the day I felt that what I was doing was more important than helping my mother unload the groceries from the car. Or, the first time I talked back to my mother in front of my father.

In the area of discipline, my father had no mercy. We lived in a house that had a very large lawn. At a very early age I was in charge of mowing that lawn. Most people today would not consider putting a small boy behind a power mower but, my dad was old school. I often joke that my best friend growing up was a lawn mower. It seemed as though I was always doing chores while my neighborhood friends would be sitting on the curb waiting for me to finish.

While I was attending college I would work for a temp agency for extra cash. I would get a call and I would spend the day working odd jobs. These jobs would be in all kinds of businesses from factories to warehouses. At least half of the time the foreman would approach me after work and offer me a job. I realize now that it was because of the respect and discipline I learned as a boy. Most of your children will enter the work force doing manual labor. It is a gradual climb beginning at the bottom rung of the ladder. But, if you have taught your children respect and discipline, they will rise to the very top.

In Galatians 4:1-4 Paul writes, “Now I say, as long as the heir is a child, he does not differ at all from a slave although he is owner of everything, but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by the father. So also we, while we were children, were held in bondage under the elemental things of the world. But when the fullness of time came God sent forth His Son, born of a woman born under the Law.” Although Paul is explaining our redeemed position in relation to the Law, there is another lesson. A child is under the discipline of an earthly father, even though someday he will be “the owner of everything”. As fathers we need to explain to our sons and daughters that we are training them for a higher purpose. Yes, in a way, we are treating them as slaves, but, we are training them to rule. They are on the bottom rung and every day of obedience leads them to the top rung.

### FIELD TRIP POLICY – PLEASE READ

The Lord has been so faithful in blessing Western Christian PSP and we just continue to grow and flourish! Of course, as we grow, we will need to make revisions from time to time on our guidelines and policies. These changes are for the benefit of the whole group.

In an effort to make our field trips and events a continuing success, we are asking that you adhere to the following procedures. First, when you sign-up for a field trip, please contact the field trip coordinator (usually Denise) to put your name on the list. **VERY IMPORTANT** – Please do not send a payment to Marilyn for a field trip without first signing-up. **When you sign-up for a field trip, please make your payment at the time you sign-up (unless you are on a waiting list).** If you make your reservations by telephone or email to the person coordinating the field trip, we ask that payment be sent immediately to Marilyn (unless another person is specified) and made payable to **Center for Creative Learning or CCL**. Before you sign-up for a field trip please carefully read the description in the newsletter and provide any needed information (for example: your first and last name, cell phone number, children’s ages and/or grade level, etc.) This will help cut down on the extra time involved in having to contact people to obtain the information. Once you have signed-up for a field trip and then find you need to cancel, please cross your name off the list and/or call the coordinator to let her know you are canceling. It is very time consuming to call everyone that has signed-up for a field trip to verify that they are still planning on attending. **Again, it is your responsibility to call the person coordinating that field trip ASAP to let her know you need to cancel – even if it is the day of the event. This cancellation policy applies to ALL field trips.** Also, there will be **no refunds or credits** in the event you need to cancel (unless otherwise approved by Marilyn). The reason for this is because for most of the field trips we attend, we have to give a final headcount a week to a few days before the field trip. **Once the final headcount is given, we have to pay the amount for that final headcount number even if our number goes down because of cancellations.** So if you need to cancel, please do so several weeks, if possible, in advance of the field trip you have signed-up for.

## GOLD RUSH ADVENTURE AT RILEY'S FARM



**THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 1<sup>st</sup>.** Grades K- 8<sup>th</sup>. Come and enjoy this 4-hour, "Forty-Niner" experience. After you arrive, you will be greeted by local miners and farmers bearing news of the mother lode. Head straight up to the Gold Mines to get supplies on credit and start hunting for gold! Throughout the day you'll learn about 49er life, including the feuds between the farmers and the miners and how gold was found. You might even learn first hand about supply and demand and how someone could even be charged \$100 for a glass of water, and \$1500 for rent! You'll get a nice break for lunch at high noon, in which you are served a light miner's ration lunch. At the end of the day, count up your findings and participate in a fun auction where students can win prizes for their hard work. Your day at the Gold Mine may include some of the following activities: Assayers Office, The Mine Shaft, The Gold Fields, The Cabin, The Sluice Boxes, and Gold Panning. **PLEASE NOTE** that the light lunch provided may not be enough to fill you up, so you are welcome to bring along your own lunches or you can buy lunch

there. Definitely, bring plenty of water to drink!

**TIME:** Please arrive by **9:30 am**. The tour will begin at 10:00 am and conclude around 2:00 pm.

**COST:** \$15.00 per person (kids and adults). Please indicate the number of children and their ages and the number of adults at the time of sign-up. (Please note that if younger siblings are in attendance while the tour is in progress, they will need adult supervision at all times. There are some hills and paths to walk up and down, so a stroller may not work very well). **ALSO**, when you sign-up, please indicate if you would like to buy apple pies or caramel apples (payment for these items are due when you pay for the field trip). Caramel apples are \$5.00 each and you may choose crumb crust or double-crust pies. The 3 lb. pies are \$15.00 each and the 5 lb. pies are \$18.00 each. ## PILGRIM FEAST AT SAN DIMAS CANYON PARK

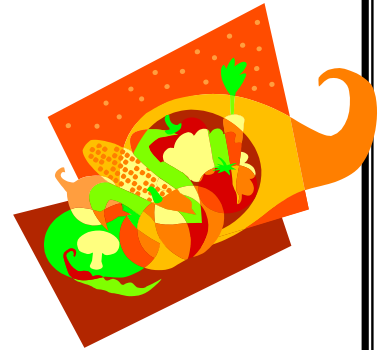

## THE HOMESTEAD MUSEUM

**THURSDAY, JANUARY 17<sup>th</sup>.** Pre-K thru 8<sup>th</sup>. The Homestead Museum is “about” many things. Most importantly, it’s a place to explore the history of the Los Angeles region from 1830 to 1930 in hopes of better understanding the past and people’s ability to shape history. The six-acre site features the Workman House, an 1870’s country home constructed around an 1840’s adobe built by William and Nicolasa Workman; La Casa Nueva, a 1920’s Spanish Colonial Revival mansion noted for its architectural crafts, built by the Workmans’ grandson, Walter Temple and his wife Laura; and El Campo Santo, one of the region’s oldest private cemeteries, containing the remains of Pio Pico, the last governor of Mexican California, and many other prominent pioneer families. The Homestead talks about the experiences of the Workman and Temple families between 1830 and 1930 to encourage visitors to think about how their own lives are part of “history.” Our group will go on the “**Ain’t We Got Fun?**” tour. This program introduces children to the history of the 1840’s, 1870’s, and 1920’s by focusing on what children would have done for fun during these decades. The program includes a visit to the museum’s historic houses with a focus on popular forms of entertainment, an 1870’s game, and a craft. The tour will take approximately 1 ½ hours. You are welcome to **bring your lunch**, there is a nice picnic area that we can enjoy after the tour.

**TIME:** Please arrive by 10:10 am. The tour will begin at 10:30 and end around 12 noon.

### Grades K—8

The K-2 grades will be doing a session on “Teaching Character through Literature” similar to the Beautiful Feet study guide. We’ll be reading, drawing, and writing or tracing simple Bible verses or stories. The 3-8 grades will be using the same type of character based literature books while learning the IEW (Institute for Excellence in Writing) skills. The students will be putting together a binder and learning basic writing skills, using IEW methods. More details to come...

#### Language Arts and Writing Class- Christy Miller- Credentialed Teacher

**Grades K-2:** We will be using "Teaching Character Through Literature" by Beautiful Feet again with different stories than last year and creating a binder of student written Bible verses. We will also be trying out a new program from IEW (The Institute for Excellence in Writing) called "Linguistic Development through Poetry Memorization." We'll also add these poems to our binder.

**Grades 3-5:** We will be using "The Student Writing Intensive" level A from IEW and reviewing and expanding on what we learned last year. The students will be putting together a binder with their notes and stories.

**Grades 6-8:** We will be using "The Student Writing Intensive" level B from IEW and reviewing and expanding on what we learned last year. The students will be putting together a binder with their notes and stories.

**\*Grades 3-8:** If you would like to practice more writing at home between class sessions I can recommend story ideas to complete at home. #### Science- Teacher: Gisela Benitez-Mendoza

Your Kindergarten through Fifth grader will use Apologia Text, *Exploring Creation with Zoology 3: Land Animals of the Sixth Day*, along with other age-appropriate science books and stories. They will have developmentally-appropriate projects, hands-on activities and experiments that will foster a safe learning environment. Your child will be asked to retell/narrate the information learned as well as create notebooks to further enhance the material we will cover in class.

**Your Sixth through Eighth grader will learn from Apologia Text, *Exploring Creation with General Science, 2nd Edition*. The students will also use materials from Apologia Exploring Creation With General Science 2nd Edition Lapbook Journal to help solidify their learning.**

They will be involved in hands-on activities and developmentally appropriate projects.

**K—3: Classes include various activities that create a joyful classroom experience that incorporates science, history, cooking and PE. A weekly theme pulls everything together to make this a fun time for your student.**

**Physical Education** involves basic movement principles which will be incorporated throughout this class, particularly in teaching skills which are specific in various games and sports. Selected activities will show a balance between individual and team emphasis, with a good attitude and sportsmanship always at the top. Physical Fitness will be addressed in every session during warm-up; skill instruction, a variety of drills and FUN lead-up games will be the sequence of each class. **Math Fundamentals (Grades 6-8)**

This is a full year course. This is a review of the foundational mathematical concepts that need to be mastered before venturing into the world of Algebra, and is ideal for those students who anticipate taking PreAlgebra the following year.

**Parent Note:** In case you're wondering about math timing: most schools in California are encouraging students to take Algebra 1 in 8th grade (I would, as well, IF the student is ready for it - but that's a big IF). If you intend for your student to be ready for Algebra 1 in 8th grade, then PreAlgebra should be taken in 7th (even though BJUPress considers it their 8th grade test), which would make this course (Fundamentals) suitable for a 6th grader (even though it's considered a 7th grade text) - or an older student, who is not ready yet for PreAlgebra.

Sections include addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of whole numbers, of decimals and of fractions, including number theory and the concepts of factors and multiples, divisibility rules, and GCF and LCM. Will also cover basic geometry, measurement (including conversions) and ratios, proportions, percentages, measurement, and if we get to it, an intro to statistics. These basic skills would be prerequisite for a Pre-Algebra course.

Students will learn concepts in class, then complete daily assignments at home. Parents will grade the daily homework, so Teacher's Edition is strongly recommended (it's much more work without it). Tests will be sent home, to be administered by a parent, and brought back to the next class session. Parent(s) encouraged to accompany students to class, in order to support study during the week.

**STUDENT MUST HAVE COMPLETED Algebra 1, Algebra 2 and Geometry, with a B or higher.**

This course is designed to prepare students for calculus and other higher math courses. Statistics and high level approximation methods are founded on calculus, which is why science, engineering, and business majors are usually required to take calculus in college. All students can benefit from the mental discipline and thought processes that are involved in this text. Concepts covered include trigonometry and trigonometric identities, polynomial operations, functions, inverse functions, polynomial, rational and radical equations, logarithms, conic sections, and their equation forms and graphs, complex numbers, matrix algebra, and statistics. There will be a **STRONG** emphasis on graphing of all types - both rectangular and polar.

Students will learn concepts in class, then complete daily assignments at home. Daily homework assignments will be corrected by student or parent. Unit tests will be sent home, to be administered by a parent, and brought back to the next class session. **TEACHER'S EDITION REQUIRED** -- Parent(s) welcome and encouraged, but not required, to accompany students to class, in order to support study during the week. The subject matter here is complex - **TOO** complex for a once a week class. It will be **TWO (2) days per week**, and it will be intense those two days :-D

**STUDENT MUST HAVE COMPLETED AT LEAST ALGEBRA I PRIOR TO ENROLLMENT.**

I do recommend, for most, that students take Alg 2 the year immediately following Alg 1, if they are intending to do BOTH classes - Alg 2 content relies HEAVILY on Alg 1 content!!

This is a presentation of Algebra as an exercise in stewardship of creation, developing thinking skills and Christlikeness . . . wow! Chapter 1 dives right into factoring polynomials, binomials, and trinomials, assuming a pretty strong mastery. Text moves through linear equations and inequalities, linear relations, quadratic equations and functions, graphing, linear programming, radicals and exponential functions and equations, imaginary and other complex numbers, rational expressions and equations, and intros to trigonometry and matrix algebra. Students will learn concepts in class, then complete daily assignments at home. Daily homework assignments will be corrected by student or parent. Unit tests will be sent home, to be administered by a parent or instructor, and brought back to the next class session. **TEACHER'S EDITION REQUIRED** -- Parent(s) welcome and encouraged, but not required, to accompany students to class, in order to support study during the week.
